DOMAINS OF RESPONSIBILITY:

Teacher Education and Inclusion Advocacy:

 Provide structured opportunities and coaching for teachers to receive information, guidance, and training on creating inclusive classrooms that cater to the diverse psychological, emotional, social, and behavioral needs of all students.

Personal and Social Development Curriculum Enhancement:

 Actively participate in the development and delivery of a comprehensive program focused on personal and social development to address the unique needs of every student.

Identification and Referral Strategies:

 Develop and implement effective strategies and tools to identify students who may require additional support in the areas of psychological, emotional, social, and behavioral health and well-being.

Social and Emotional Counseling for Well-being:

 Provide empathetic support to students who seek advice or are identified for support regarding psychological, social, emotional, and behavioral health, emphasizing an inclusive approach that



caters to the diverse needs of the student body.

Parent Education:

• Establish and facilitate structured opportunities for parents to receive information and guidance regarding the holistic development and challenges of children in the primary years.

Academic Counseling:

• Offer support to students who seek advice or are referred for academic concerns, ensuring the individual strengths and challenges of each student are considered.

Building a Network of External Service Providers:

• Cultivate a diverse network of professionals who can provide specialized assistance to students and families facing challenges in psychological, emotional, social, and behavioral health.

Emergency Response and Crisis Management:

Actively participate in the Emergency Management Team, contributing to the development of
plans to manage crises and other situations, ensuring that the emotional and social support
needs of all members of the school community are considered.

Student Support Team Member:

 Collaborate with Learning Support teachers, EAL teachers, and Counselors throughout the school to ensure holistic, inclusive support and tiered behavioral interventions for students within an MTSS framework.

Child Protection and Welfare:

• Act as a key player in securing the protection and well-being of all children, taking a lead role in safeguarding initiatives and participating in child protection response teams.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- **Education**: An appropriate college or university qualification from an accredited institution. The counsellor is responsible for filing appropriate documentation (full transcripts and copies of diplomas) with Human Resources (normally this includes at least a Bachelor's and master's degrees in an appropriate field).
- **Certification**: Ideally an appropriate state-issued certification to act as a school counsellor, school psychologist or within the field of social and emotional support.
- **Teaching Certificate**: the candidate must have a teaching certification (i.e. teaching license, QTS etc.)
- Experience: A minimum of two years' experience in a related position is preferred.
